Happy Easter!

I hope that by the time you read this the weather will have cheered-up. As I write we are having a few more days of snow flurries and Spring seems to be on hold. A number of people have said to me that this winter has felt like a long one, and so now we are really looking forward to the warmer days ahead.

The warmer weather will be a blessing in many ways, and at the church we hope to take advantage of it on the 14th May when we will hold a Rogation service. Starting at the church we will walk across the field path to Charlton, pausing to pray, hear readings from the Bible and sing hymns.

This tradition has deep roots in England. Introduced in the year 747, around the time that the parish system was created, Rogation became a useful way to mark, or inspect, the boundaries of the parishes. Its name derives from the latin *rogare*, meaning 'to ask'. On Rogation Sunday we are asking for God's blessing on the parish.

Although it now persists mostly in the countryside, there was a time when Rogation services were held almost everywhere. We see the memory of them preserved in place names such as Gospel Oak in London, so called because that was the location at which a reading from the gospels was given as part of the Rogation service.

Rogation day has also customarily been a time of celebration and feasting. We will keep this tradition with refreshments served after the service at Walnut House, the home of Sir Paul and Lady Hayter. Do come along to the family service, there will be opportunities for children to take part in the worship. It will also be a wonderful opportunity to enjoy our beautiful surroundings in all their Springtime glory.



Nature Notes

We had a classic 'blackthorn winter' recently, when we had a sudden patch of really cold weather with snow and quite hard frosts, just when the blackthorn was in bloom. This is the rather stark white blossom along the hedgerows on very bare dark stems with vicious thorns. It leafs up after the blossom has been and gone and will produce sloes in the autumn. These are a member of the plum family (prunus spinosus).

We had a few mornings in March when we found Mr. and Mrs. Mallard walking around our pond. This is a formal pool really, and quite small, but it looked as if they were prospecting for a nesting site. Delightful as it would have been to watch the progress of a mallard nest and its ducklings, I had to tell them that it wasn't a very sensible place to start a family. With a quite large dog who takes a very great interest in birds, and two hunting cats, the ducklings wouldn't have stood a chance. We think they took the hint and we hope that they have found a suitable alternative.

Once we've had the blackthorn (often in February and it can go on into April – spring is late this year) we're into a succession of flowering trees as they have evolved to stagger their blossom to coincide with the emergence of different pollinators. Blackthorn is vital for the first queen bees as they emerge, and also for overwintering butterflies like the comma, small tortoiseshell and brimstone. Then we have wild cherries in April, of two kinds – the single white flowers of *Prunus avium* and the drooping white racemes of Bird Cherry (*prunus padus*). Then there's crab apple in pink and white, for the next tranche of moths, beetles and butterflies, and in May hedgerows froth in creamy hawthorn blossom with elderflower following on. Hazel catkins have already been and gone and these produce the male pollen, billions of grains of it, which blow in the wind, and the female flowers, tiny hot-pink blooms along the branches, catch it as it floats by. Then, with any luck, there will be hazelnuts (but the squirrels will get them all).

The Woodland Trust's Nature's Calendar, which collects and collates thousands of observations of phenological events (the first budburst, the arrival of migratory birds – and much more), shows that there has been a startling leap forward in the flowering dates of our native trees. Last year the first elderflowers appeared 14 days earlier than in 2001, hazel 36 days earlier, blackthorn 24. Over the millennia trees and plants have developed in symbiosis so that freshly hatched pollinators and insects waking from hibernation find the food they need at the time that they need it. Some of these insects are sensitive to spring temperatures so they may be able to keep in step with earlier flowering times. But there is more worry about solitary bees, which typically emerge in early April. The 270 species of solitary bees and 25 bumblebees are very important pollinators for orchard trees – apples, pears, cherries, and plums, but their eggs take a year to hatch so their emergence is regulated by time not by temperature, and they may emerge too late to pollinate the earliest orchard blossom, generally plums and pears.

We had a lot of early crocuses out at the beginning of March and when the sun was out they opened up and were alive with bees. Primroses are coming out now and the first violets in purple and white along the verges. Spring has definitely sprung.

Present – Parish Councillors Michael Loggin (Chairman), Linda Baker, Mark Bracey, Kevin Ridge, Wayne Rule and Matthew Walsh and Theresa Goss (Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer).

Annual Parish Meeting (APM) 2023 – The APM is being held on Monday 17 April 2023 at 7.30pm in the Memorial Hall and all residents are invited to attend to find out what the Parish Council has been working on for the last 12 months. Village organisations are also invited to attend and report on their work too.

Flagpole – The Memorial Hall Committee has kindly given the Parish Council permission to erect a flagpole in the car park of their grounds. It is hoped it can be installed in time for the Coronation on 6 May 2023.

Playing Field and Pavilion – A container, up to the value of £2000, will be purchased by the Parish Council for additional storage on the site. Concerns about matchday parking were raised and contact will be made with Brackley Athletic FC to discuss these further. **'No Mow May'** – The Parish Council has agreed to take part in this initiative, which will mean none of the grass verges in the village will be cut during May. The benefits of not cutting the grass are to encourage and support biodiversity and wildlife.

Community Bus Service – A community bus service was being run from the village to Brackley, Northampton, Banbury and Towcester. For more information, please call 'Ability' on 01327 604123.

Defibrillator Training – A defibrillator training session is being arranged for a Saturday morning in June. The session will last about 2 hours and there are 12 places available. If any residents are interested in attending, please email the Clerk after 1 April 2023. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis and names will not be added to the list until after 1 April 2023.

Defibrillator Cabinet – Investigations will be made into purchasing a cabinet to house the defib at the Playing Field to enable it to be accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Street Lighting – If any street lights are not working, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council with the lamp number/location and this information will be forwarded to Eon. Please bear in mind that the street lighting contract is between the Parish Council and Eon, so if residents contact Eon directly, they may not get a response.

Parking Issues – The Parish Council kindly requests that drivers do not park their vehicles on the footpaths in the village or at junctions.

Parking at a junction means that visibility is reduced for drivers turning in and out and forces them to drive on the wrong side of the road without knowing if there is on-coming traffic, which is clearly dangerous.

Parking on footpaths means that pedestrians and especially those with pushchairs or wheelchairs have to move into the road to get past the vehicle. This is also clearly very dangerous and residents should not be putting other residents in this dangerous position, especially when everyone is so aware of the speeding issues through the village.

Please park considerately in the village

Dog Waste Bin – The replacement dog waste bin on the Cemetery footpath will be fitted shortly.

The Coronation of HM King Charles III – The Parish Council will make a contribution of £200 towards the cost of the bouncy castle hire for the Coronation event which is being planned in the village.

Planning – The Parish Council has no objections to the following application: WNS/2023/0288/FUL—Colready Farm, Farthinghoe Road, Charlton Erection of a cattle shed.

The following planning application has been approved by West Northamptonshire Council's Planning Committee/Planning Officers, since the last meeting of the Parish Council: 4 Cartwright Road, Charlton

A rear extension to the dwelling and replacement of a flat roof at the rear with a pitched roof to match the original roof. Conversion and extension of the garage to create habitable accommodation, for use by family members and with short term holiday letting use.
